


The Frankton School Korowai

The Hukahuka

The blue hukahuka represents 'Kia Tika'.

The red hukahuka represents 'Kia Pono'.

Hukahuka are made by twisted thread that they put together into bundles. Finally, they carefully sew the hukahuka onto the Korowai.


The Lower Taaniko

MAWHITIWHITI PATTERNS

The cluster of the mawhitiwhiti patterns

placement here highlights the idea of

"students at the centre" where students

are embraced, protected and cared for by

the virtues of the school motto.



The first row of mawhitiwhiti patterns represent all of the people in the wider and local community surrounding Frankton School and their associations to the school-past, present and future. The mawhitiwhiti patterns form a complete square and represent how the teachers and staff work to create a safe place for every student to learn and live with the history of Te Kaiwhakamarumaru.

The Feathers - Huruhuru

THE STORY BEHIND THE FEATHERS.

The feathers of the Korowai represent hauora-the protection, warmth and nurturing that all staff at the school provide for all their students. These feathers are reminders of how staff, families and community surround, support and care for each student's physical, mental, spitritual and emotional development.



UPPER TAANIKO



The upper Taaniko provides a connection between the school, Te Ao Maaori and it's physical and spiritual environment. The green represents Papatuuaanuku- the Earth mother and the blue represents Ranginui- the sky father. The Taaniko depicts three maunga connected to the school.

Ngaati Maahanga.
Ngaati Maahanga is recognised as holding mana whenua. Karioi is described as a beautiful princess, depicted wearing a magnificent crown.




Pirongia is depicted with Patupaiarehe.

There are many stories of supernatural beings who dwell upon Pirongia under the cover of night. Pirongia is just one of a number of ancestral locations where Patupaiarehe reside.

Taupiri maunga is a sacred place for Waikato Tainui. Taupiri is the final resting place for many descendents of Tainui Waka. Taupiri maunga is depicted with the Seven Stars of Matariki.
